On the last day before half term, Reception enjoyed a morning exploring our school grounds to learn all about the season of Autumn. The children used their senses to see what they could see, hear, smell and feel at this special time of year as they investigated the woods, field and Willow Dome. resources, using colourful leaves to create repeating patterns on our autumn crowns, as well as using leaves, sticks, conkers and acorns to make animal pictures. The children learned all about pumpkins and how they are harvested, before enjoying the story of pumpkin soup. After this, children were challenged to make their own imaginary autumn soup, suggesting ingredients the children might find in the autumn. Finally, every child planted some basil seeds which they have taken home to care for, having first identified all the things a seed would need to grow such as water and sunlight.
