
How can I help this term?

Fireworks:

Fireworks night is by far our biggest fundraiser of the year and is open to the general public. Due to the size of the event we rely on a large amount of volunteers to pull it together.

- We are after parents willing to **join the pyrotechnics and bonfire team**. This role involves setting up, igniting and safe clearing up of the bonfire and fireworks.



- **Saturday morning**- It doesn't end with the last bang. We need volunteers between 7.30am-10am to clear up the field and make it safe, ready for school on Monday and the football training the school hosts over the weekend.

We really couldn't do it without the hard work and efforts of our parents and staff, so again a huge thank you!



How are we spending?

What did we buy? What are we saving for?

Unfortunately things 'cost money! I had a parent once say the HTSA doesn't need money, we have lots in the bank'. What they didn't realise was that money was saved to contribute to big projects, such as £12,000 towards the Reception Playground, £19,000 towards new buildings and £17,000 towards outdoor education facilities- it all mounts up.

What did we buy last year?

Library books: £862 Class Xmas party and gifts £698 ELSA room and Maths equipment: £1533 Road safety signs: £389 Leavers bibles £283



What are we saving for?

We are currently saving to contribute to the following big project; a large shed/container to store PE and outdoor equipment, with plans for an outdoor seating area around it to be used for outdoor learning and a place to sit and chill at play times.

Also on the school's wish list is the KS1 staging (outdoor area), revamping more classrooms and contributing towards Opal play; a new outdoor learning programme designed to encourage outdoor play and learn risk assessment skills.

Sadly we can't afford to do it all, so have prioritised the storage and outdoor seating area as it has the most beneficial reach.

Obviously the more we can raise this year the more we can contribute to the school's wish list. So please, please try and help where you can so we can continue to provide wonderful facilities and opportunities for our children.
